First, I wish you a blessed Easter. He has risen. He has risen, indeed. I hope that you will be more aware of the depth and breadth of God's love for you personally.

On to the projects, first on the list is the Transition Team and the results of the Cottage meetings. We were thrilled to see such good attendance at all the Cottage meetings, a testament to your active participation. We want to extend our heartfelt thanks to the hosts of each cottage meeting. The discussions in each group were insightful and productive. The team noticed some common factors across all four groups, a clear indication of our shared vision and commitment. Below is a brief list ordered around Strengths, Internal Challenges, and External Challenges.

Strengths: a beautiful church facility, a lively Sunday School program, a dynamic music program, a strong core of committed members

Internal Challenges: poor attendance and participation by many members, growth in membership, resistance to change, lack of Adult Education, Lack of understanding the mission of the church, understandable sermons

External Challenges: Lack of pastors in the market place, Non-Church activities providing competition, multiple Lutheran Churches in the same town, inflation, more appealing on-line opportunities, smaller communities.

The Transition team is focused on several areas in the next couple of months: The Mission of the Church, Worship and Technology and more opportunities for fellowship and involvement. Speaking of fellowship **the Transition Team is hosting a Coffee Bar this Easter Sunday before service.** Come early and get a treat and cup of coffee.

The next project in this potpourri is the Mutual Ministry Team. Members from both St Paul's Council and St John's Council have met and are looking for ways to do ministry together. Several possibilities have grown out of those meetings. This Easter Sunday I will be preaching at both congregations and both choirs will perform at both congregations. In the future we hope to sponsor a community picnic together.

Finally, the call committee is taking shape and should begin work at the end of this month.

Weaknesses included poor attendance, lack of involvement, membership growth, low volunteer participation, resistance to change, budget, lack of adult education and understanding sermons. External challenges identified included lack of pastors, non-church activities scheduled at church times. multiple Lutheran churches in the community, inflation, more appealing opportunities available online, smaller community and changing theologies. The team will continue to meet and study the


