

The Art of Waiting

That the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. ²² For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. ²³ And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴ For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

Romans 8:24-25

The average person spends over six months of their life waiting in line. And over a month waiting on hold for customer service. Those two statements are internet facts, so take them with at least a grain of salt. Whether the above two facts are entirely true or not, we do a great deal of waiting in our lifetimes. We wait in line and on the phone. We wait for relatives to arrive and for a spouse to get ready so we can leave. We wait to see the doctor and the dentist. We do a lot of waiting.

This time of year, the waiting intensifies as we wait for Christmas. Children can hardly wait until that special day. Parents often have that same excitement as they anticipate their children's response. You might be waiting to see someone's reaction to a gift you have bought them. Or you might just be waiting for all the hoopla and hullabaloo to be over, so you can return to your normal schedule.

The season of Advent is all about waiting, and not just waiting to celebrate Christmas, but rather, the type of waiting that Paul talks about in the eighth chapter of Romans. Underneath all our normal everyday waiting is a profound desire you might be unaware of. It is the desire for the creation and our lives to be set right. The fulfillment of that desire, whether we know it or not, is what all of us are waiting for. It is the hope of the Gospel.

But how, as Paul says, do we wait for it with patience? We can learn from the Old Testament prophets how to wait. They can teach us attitudes that help us wait with patience, whether that waiting is mundane or profound.

This Advent the sermon series is, "What Are You Waiting For, attitudes and habits from the Old Testament Prophets to help us wait." I can't wait to start it.

M/S/P to approve the Secretary's Report of the October 9, 2024 meeting.

M/S/P to approve the Financial Statement as printed.

Pastor's Report

- •Conducted two pre-Baptism meetings.
- •Conducted three baptisms on November 10 for Addison & Briella Thompson and Kentyn Salonek.
- •Conducted new member orientation for two families.
- •Conducted funerals for Sharon Rogotzke and Greg Jensen.
- •Conducted two in-home communions.
- •Teaching Confirmation classes for St. Paul's and St. Johns students. They are now studying the ten commandments.
- •Continuing to conduct worship services at St. Johns Church. Also doing pastoral care for those activities that intersect with the worship service at the church.

Parish Education

- •Sunday School room updates continue to be worked on.
- •Sunday School Christmas Program is set for December 15. Parts will be handed out on November 17. Rehearsals will be November 24 and December 8. There will be no Sunday School December 1 due to the Thanksgiving holiday.
- •Plans are in the works for a combined Luther League youth group with St. Johns Church. Shawna Jacobs (St. Paul's) and Brenda

Anderson (St. Johns) will be leaders.


•The Luther League checkbook needs to be set up with two signers on record at the bank. M/S/P to remove current signers and have Shawna Jacobs and Katie Mueller be the new signers of the checkbook at this time.

Old Business

- •Sue Hendrickson gave an update on revitalizing the local thrift store. It will be called Community Treasures and will operate as a 501(c)(3) business.
- •Parsonage window replacement has been ordered and painting will be done in the spring. Photos and estimates were sent to the insurance company.
- •The outside church doors on the south side of the church will need to be refinished in the spring. Will ask Al if he would like to do the job or have us hire someone to complete it.
- •It was noted that some of the brickwork around and above the south doors needs to be cleaned up with a pressure washer in the spring.
- •The Call Committee has been meeting. They have scheduled Zoom Calls/Interviews with two perspective candidates in the near future.
- •M/S/P to accept the snow removal quotes for the church and parsonage by Saw Works, Inc.
- •M/S/P to set the Christmas Eve service at 6:00 p.m. December 24.
- •Thanksgiving Eve Service will be at 7:00 p.m. Wednesday, November 27. St. Johns Church will join us. There will be a dessert potluck following. Church Council members were asked to help with serving and clean-up.
- •Thanksgiving Ecumenical Service and Dinner will be November 24 at 5:00 p.m. at Community Center. St. Paul's will furnish buns and butter for the dinner. Everyone is asked to bring a dessert or salad to share at the meal. Volunteers are needed that day at 1:00 p.m. to help set up the Center for the service and dinner.

New Business

- •Staff reviews will be scheduled in December. Paul asked for some volunteers to serve on the committee. Kathy Pederson agreed to be part of it.
- •Nominating Committee will need to begin meeting. Katie will get list ready of who will be needed for the Church Council positions. Paul asked for volunteers for the committee.



- •M/S/P to decorate the church for Christmas immediately following the 9:00 a.m. worship service December 1.
- •M/S/P to assemble the Sunday School treat bags at 7 p.m. Wednesday, December 11.
- •Kathy reported that eight shut-ins were visited in October and November by St. Paul's shut-in committee. The Church Council will assist with the December visits on Sunday, December 22. A small gift will be part of each visit.
- •M/S/P to hold the Annual Meeting on Sunday, February 2, 2025, following the 9 a.m. worship service.
- •A letter was read from LCMC with an appeal for additional funding from the member congregations. Pastor Carl will get some more information regarding this and report at the December meeting.
- •We have been having problems with pastor's body mike used at worship services. The cost to make repairs was more than a brand-new microphone. M/S/P to purchase a new microphone that is compatible to our sound system.
- •Jeff inquired on thoughts regarding the Praise Service format being used the second Sunday of the month of each month. The general consensus was that everyone liked them and thought the change was good.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer. M/S/P to adjourn at 8:40 p.m. Next meeting will be Wednesday, December 11 at 7:45 p.m.
