

Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. 1st Corinthians 13:7

So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love. Pursue love,

1 Corinthians 13:13-14:1a

Halfway through the month of February, we celebrated St. Valentine's Day, which in our contemporary society has been to celebrate the ideals of love. What do we mean when we say "love"? The word love is one of the most used and abused words in English. We might say to our wife or husband, "I love you." In the next breath, we might say, "I love chocolate". So, what does the word love actually mean? For us as Christians, that word has added depth. Scripture talks about the love of God. So, how should we define the word love? And how should we live our lives in light of that of the definition?

Koine Greek, the original language of the New Testament, had three words for that word love. The first word is *Eros*. It is where we get the word erotic. It is the intimate physical love shared between two people. Erotic love is not evil. It includes intimate physical affection between a husband and wife. Of course, it can be twisted and turned to evil purposes, but it is not evil in and of itself. It is a gift from a good God. Most people celebrate this type of love on Valentine's Day.

The second Greek word is *Filia*. It is most commonly translated as friendship. Philadelphia is two Greek words that literally mean "the city of friendship" or the more common phrase, the City of brotherly love. Of course, friendship is another gift from a good God. There can be, however, a transactional nature to friendship. In other words, we are friends to some people and not to other people for good reasons. Sometimes those reasons are manipulative. "I am friends with Tom because he can help me advance my career. At other times, they can be for noble reasons. I am friends with Teresa because she understands me. Whether noble or manipulative, there are always reasons we make friends.

The final Greek word is *Agape*, Which is God's love. It is the love mentioned in the above two passages. What is the difference? God's love is never transactional but sacrificial. It is the love that led Jesus to die on the cross; it is the love that God shows to you, and hopefully, it is love that we can nurture and pursue in our congregation because it is the love that is eternal.

Parish Coordinator Katie Mueller and Financial Secretary Anita Jensen were also present. Pastor Carl led the group in prayer. M/S/P to accept the Consent Agenda. M/S/P to approve the Secretary's Report of the December 11, 2024 meeting. M/S/P to approve the Financial Statement as printed.

Pastor's Report

- •Conducted five in-home communions. Putting together a list of those receiving in-home communion to leave for the next pastor.
- Conducted four counseling sessions.
- •Put together policy to guide himself and next pastor on the disbursement of funds to those in need (Good Samaritan Fund and Pastor's Discretionary Fund).
- •Teaching Confirmation classes for St. Paul's and St. Johns students.
- •Continuing to conduct worship services at St. Johns Church. They voted on January 5 to call Pastor Kelly Wasburg and he will start some time in February.
- •Will begin a new book study on January 13. Based on the book *Junk Drawer Jesus:* Discarding Your Spiritual Clutter and Rediscovering the Supremacy of Grace.

Parish Education

- Committee did not meet in January.
- •Shawna Jacobs addressed the board regarding Luther League. They had a successful cookie sale December 15 and profited \$445. They are planning events for the remainder of the school year. Would like to do a lock-in/movie night at church sometime in February. M/S/P to allow them to have the lock-in. There will be some other parent supervisors involved, too.

Prairie Plans Investment Report


•John Mueller, Prairie Plans, addressed the council, reporting on results of our investment portfolio in 2024. The portfolio performed well. He went over each of St. Paul's accounts. M/S/P to print the report in the 2024 Annual Report. M/S/P to move from MWP to SAM (in house) management of our portfolio funds in 2025.

Old Business

- •Parsonage window replacement has arrived and will be installed along with painting in the spring. Photos and estimates were sent to the insurance company but have not heard back from them.
- •The outside church doors on the south side of the church will be refinished in the spring.
- •Going to get price quotes to repaint the altar area in the sanctuary. Also to look at issues around vents in the sanctuary ceiling.
- •The Call Committee had a second Zoom meeting with a potential candidate but have not heard back. Will follow up and also work on the search.
- •Staff reviews were completed. M/S/P to approve the suggested raises for the staff: Raise to \$18.00/hr. Katie, Anita and Al and to \$17.50 for Mary Jo. M/S/P to approve an additional week of vacation for Parish Coordinator (10 years of service).
- •Nominating Committee has been working on filling positions with little success. Kathy, Jake, Sarah, Kim and Randy have agreed to another term. Angel and Kelly's terms are not up this year. Need to fill Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Secretary positions.
- •M/S/P to approve the 2025 budget with the salaries and insurance figures added to it. The 2025 benevolence percentage will be voted on at the annual meeting.

New Business

- •The Church Council will be installed at the 9:00 service on Sunday, February 9.
- •The SAFE Annual Meeting will be held Sunday, January 12 at 2 p.m. at the United Methodist Church. Our reps, Angel and Sarah, were encouraged to attend.




•The Agenda for the 2025 Annual Meeting was reviewed and approved.


