## **Old Business**

•Discussion on Transition Team. Team members so far are Angel Clemon, Jeremy Dove, Kelly Sargent, Jena Veenstra and Sarah Groebner. Sarah and Pastor will begin organizing the group.

•We met with St. Johns Church Council preceding our meeting. Continued discussions on possible pairing and sharing of the congregations. Setting up a task force—three from each church—to work on ideas and plans. Jeff Krueger volunteered to be one of the members.

•Discussion on the Call Committee. Would like to get it set up before the Annual

Meeting. Need to find a chairman for the committee. Two pastoral candidates have contacted the church—will follow up with them.

•Nominating Committee. No one has stepped up for any positions other than Chairman for next year. We will need a Vice-Chairman (willing to be Chairman following year), Treasurer and one Council Person. There are also other committees that will need members. Will announce in church and put in bulletin.

•Parking Lot Disturbance Issues—Kathy talked with the Springfield Police. The last one was a domestic issue which has been resolved. The police have been told they can again patrol the parking lot. Cameras may be a possibility in the future.

•Marie Weinberger Trust—Paul Muske is working with Anita to distribute the funds to the church for this year. Money will go to the Heritage Fund, Parish Education and Scholarship Funds among others.

## **New Business**

•2024 Budget: The Budget Committee met and created the budget for 2024 and it was presented to the Council. The benevolence percentage will be determined at the Annual Meeting. There is a section in the Budget set-up for the Interim Ministry. The Pastor figures will not be filled in until we get a new pastor along with his/her contract. Church Staff reviews were discussed and salaries for 2024 determined. M/S/P to accept the 2024 salaries for the staff.

•M/S/P to accept the resignations of John Mueller and Denise Gicker from the Church Council effective immediately. Jeff Krueger has agreed to be the Interim Church Council Chairman.

•Christmas items will be taken down by the Council on Sunday, January 14 at 1:30 p.m. •M/S/P to give Christmas gifts to Parish Coordinator, Financial Secretary, Housekeeper, Custodian and Pastor. Jeff will take care of putting them together.

M/S/P to adjourn at 9:50 p.m. We closed with the Lord's Prayer. Next meeting will be Wednesday, January 10, 2024 at 7:30 p.m.


