Do you have a junk drawer at home? A place where you put useless items that you think you might need someday. We call it "The drawer where things end up" at our house. Many of us have a Spiritual junk drawer where spiritual thoughts and religious ideas end up: a half-remembered Sunday school lesson from your childhood, a recently heard podcast, or a sermon from a long ago that stuck with you. Some of those ideas are helpful, and others are not as helpful and maybe even harmful. From time to time, it is worth evaluating those ideas.

That is why, in January, we will start a new book study, **Junk Drawer Jesus: Discarding Your Spiritual Clutter and Rediscovering the Supremacy of Grace.** The book's subtitle describes the book accurately. The book looks at some spiritual ideas that can hinder you from living out your faith in daily life. It deals with some of those thoughts and ideas that hinder us from a close and fulfilling relationship with our loving Heavenly Father. Ideas include seeing God as some heavenly referee watching to ensure that we play strictly by the rules or how we can truly hear God's voice as we live our lives. Here is a quote that gets at the heart of the book,

"The irony, as we will discover, is that apart from the message of Christ crucified and resurrected for sinners, we end up building the very thing we claim to abhor, a system laden with expectation and burdens, blind spots and bigotries. We build something that robs us of joy and drives us further from the peace and hope we're so desperate to find."

The purpose of this book is to help us to clear out those blind spots, burdens, and bigotries from our life.

I am not big into New Year resolutions, but I believe in setting goals for the New Year. Let me encourage you to set a goal to read this book and weave its wisdom into your life. I seldom say this about a book, but I think this book can be life-changing. It will above all help you to *let the word of Christ dwell in you richly*.

To help those of us who would like to explore this book, St Paul's will be starting a book study at the beginning of the New Year. You can sign up at worship or call the office. The book study will begin on January 13, 2025.

Parish Coordinator Katie Mueller and Financial Secretary Anita Jensen were also present.

Pastor Carl led the group in prayer. M/S/P to accept the Consent Agenda. M/S/P to approve the Secretary's Report of the November 13, 2024 meeting. M/S/P to approve the Financial Statement as printed.

Pastor's Report

- •Conducted three in-home communions.
- •Conducted service and communion at St. John's Home.
- Distributed funds from the Good Samaritan Fund to individuals needing financial assistance.
- •Teaching Confirmation classes for St. Paul's and St. Johns students. They will begin studying the Apostles' Creed.
- •Continuing to conduct worship services at St. Johns Church. They are moving forward with calling Pastor Kelly. Will not be needed at St. Johns for December 15, 24 or 29 services.
- •Will begin a new book study in January. Based on the book *Junk Drawer Jesus:* Discarding Your Spiritual Clutter and Rediscovering the Supremacy of Grace.

Parish Education

- •Sunday School room updates continue to be worked on.
- •Sunday School Christmas Program is set for December 15 at 10:00 a.m.
- •There will be no Sunday School on December 22 or December 29.
- •Beginning plans for Vacation Bible School. St. Paul's will host this year. Theme will be "True North-Trusting Jesus in a Wild World." Krystal Plaster and Megan Hillesheim will be part of the committee.

Old Business

- •Parsonage window replacement has been ordered and painting will be done in the spring. Photos and estimates were sent to the insurance company.
- •The outside church doors on the south side of the church will need to be refinished in the spring. Al will do the refinishing work on the doors.
- •The Call Committee has been meeting. They had zoom meetings with two candidates and sent them some materials about our church and the community. One is still a seminary student. Will be setting up additional meetings with them.
- •Paul and Kathy will do Staff Reviews before the holidays.
- •Nominating Committee has been working on filling positions. Gary Renner is helping Paul with the task. Will need to fill Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Secretary positions on the council. Kathy, Jake, Sarah and Randy have agreed to another term. Kim will be asked. Angel and Kelly's terms are not up this year.
- •The Budget Committee met and set the budget for 2025. It was reviewed at the meeting. Nothing budgeted to the Epiphany District at this time unless we receive more information from the group. Also decided to cut the landline at the parsonage as most now use cell phones.
- •Our budgeted amount of \$750 was sent to LCMC for the year. They had asked congregations to consider donating to them.
- •Christmas shut-in visits will take place Sunday, December 22 following worship service. Everyone was encouraged to come and help with the project.
- •The Community Treasures Thrift Store budget and business plan was reviewed by the board. At this time, they are just looking for volunteers to help at the store.

New Business

- •St. Johns Church is having a speaker from the Mission Pilot Program on December 29. We will have the speaker at our 9:00 a.m. worship service December 29 as well.
- •Taylor Milbrath of the EPIC Kids Youth Program made a request for our church to help prepare and serve meals for the

project. It is open to kids in Kindergarten through sixth grade. They meet every Wednesday evening at the school. The consensus was that we will not help with the project at this time.

•Katie Mueller requested permission to use the sofa in one of the Sunday School rooms for set props for the One Act Play at school. Permission was granted and the school can also keep it if they would like.

•M/S/P to give Christmas gifts to the church staff again this year. Paul, Jeff and Anita will work on the project.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer. M/S/P to adjourn at 8:25 p.m. Next meeting will be Wednesday, January 8 at 7:45 p.m.




