Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Greetings! The joke around Springfield these days is, "The last pastor out, please close the door." Likely you've heard that Pastor Bennett at St John's has resigned his call, along with his wife, Jennifer, who pastored the Jeffers and Storden LCMC congregations. UMC and St. Ray's are also getting new pastors soon. In addition, the newly formed LCMC congregation in Slayton is still seeking a pastor, as are New Hope in Comfrey and Our Savior's in Lamberton, who both currently have interim pastors. A clergy shortage is sweeping our nation and hitting especially hard close to home.

There are many factors that are contributing to the shortage. A very large percentage of pastors have or are about to reach retirement age. Many pastors decided to retire during the pandemic. Seminaries in general are struggling to recruit new students. And many of the students they do enroll are far older than was typical, which means that those seminary graduates will only be in the ministry for a limited number of years. The rate at which our culture is becoming secularized is increasing and directly impacts how many people feel "called" to the ordained ministry.

The Romans passage above reminds us that saving faith is dependent upon hearing the Word of Christ. No matter what we attempt, it is all in God's hands. There is no magic bullet, winning strategy, or singular "answer" to address the clergy shortage. We may think that our Lord should fix our clergy shortage right now. Yet Luther reminds us:

"The clock cannot strike one before it has struck twelve; there cannot be any summer until winter is past, nor can it be evening until it is day; one cannot be old until one has been a child. Everything is fixed in a time. . . It is not man's thought that rules. God must give everything its time. We cannot go out and pick berries at Christmas; we must wait till they are in season. Hence it is the time that gives the fruit, rather than the field or the garden; for the field is there all year, but if its season has not come, there is no yield; that must have its time." (Luther on Vocation, Gustaf Wingren, p. 216-217)

Due to the clergy shortage, LCMC pastors in our area recently met to brainstorm ways to assist local congregations who are without a called pastor now and in the future. The plan is to also gather congregational leaders soon to discuss opportunities to serve neighboring churches so that they can hear the Word of Christ and be sustained in their faith. Watch for more information in the coming months.

St. Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 12:26, "If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it..." The connection between people as members of the Body of Christ is designed by God to be like the connection between our human body parts. It is at such a time as this that we are called to support our fellow members, so that the Body of Christ does not suffer and weaken. See you in church!


