

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Lenten greetings! Since our Ash Wednesday worship service was canceled, I thought I would write on the reading, Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21, which is from the Sermon on the Mount.

While speaking to crowds, Jesus refers to the Pharisees, who were considered the most pious and godly among the people. Jesus had attacked the Pharisees' false teachings and now he goes after the way they live their lives, warning us not to do likewise.

Jesus comes to us in this reading like a physician doing an examination during a routine physical. Maybe we report no serious spiritual concerns, no spiritual aches or pains, no spiritual shortness of breath. Perhaps we declare to Christ that we feel spiritually fit as a fiddle.

While we may appear perfectly healthy on the outside, Christ's examination reveals something troubling on the inside. Looking right into our hearts, he shares the shocking diagnosis, "You have a heart condition." In the shocked silence that follows, Jesus begins listing the symptoms so that we might examine our own hearts.

First, Jesus starts with giving to the needy, which is pleasing to God. Yet there is a great temptation to make to draw attention to ourselves when we give, which is called virtue signaling, so that others see us as generous. Then when we receive admiration from others, it may then stimulate us to greater works, so that the eyes of others will turn even more to us. But this, Jesus warns, makes our works ruined in God's eyes, and reflects that we are not only misleading and deceiving others, but ourselves as well.

Next Jesus narrows in on our prayer, which is meant to be intimate heart-to-heart conversation with our Heavenly Father. Jesus says don't be like the hypocrites who pray in public, on the street, or in the synagogue. When the Jews prayed three times a day, 9:00, noon, and 3:00 p.m., the hypocrites would place themselves where they could be seen. Here Jesus calls us to examine ourselves and admonishes us against praying in such a way that others will be impressed with us so that we may gain a reputation for having great piety.

Both practices, which are good in themselves, can be distorted in ways that draw us into idolatry. When we seek the honor and glory for ourselves that belongs rightly to God, we show our hearts to be far from him. In this way, we are putting our best wares in the front show-window while behind the counter there is nothing but junk. Jesus speaks of those who display their outward acts of piety in this way as whitewashed tombs. The outside is beautiful, but inside there is only death and decay.


And then finally Jesus hits on the big one: storing up treasures here on earth. If the first two didn't strike a nerve, this one will. Now there is nothing inherently wrong with having money or with having possessions. They can be used for great good in taking care of our neighbors. But here Jesus is concerned about greed. How easy it is for us to get all wrap up in money and possessions, placing our trust in them to protect us and give us fulfillment. We can gauge where our hearts lie based on what they do when the stock market makes a record dive, or the commodity prices plunge. Do our hearts plummet with them? The devil, the world, and our sinful selves are ever trying to draw us into worshipping the idol Mammon, so that we will devote ourselves and our time to pursuing wealth, which we believe is our greatest treasure. When we fall to the temptation to worship Mammon, he shows himself to be a cruel and heartless god who robs us of peace and constantly threatens death.

But for no good reason that we can fathom, we are too beloved to be left in our brokenness. Jesus knows what we need: a heart transplant! David begs for this in Psalm 51, "Create in me a clean heart, O, God, and put a new and right spirit within me." We need Christ to remove our wayward, fickle heart that constantly chase after false gods and replace it with a new clean heart that will fear, love and trust God above all.

Thankfully there is no need to put you on a transplant waiting list, but our Lord can do the procedure by speaking to you the Word of Christ. On the cross, our Lord Jesus bore our infirmities and carried our diseases, defeating them through his innocent suffering and death, that you may receive a new clean heart through the forgiveness of your sins.

Each Sunday, Wednesday during Lent (weather permitting), and by appointment, you are invited to hear the Word of God that you may receive a new clean heart. See you in church! Love from your sister in Christ,


