

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Another class of Confirmation students is being confirmed on April 29! Part of what we study during Confirmation is what God does with sinners: specifically how God keeps promises though God's people are unfaithful.

What is a promise? It is a declaration or assurance that one will do a particular thing or that a particular thing will happen. When the Lord makes a promise, we can trust in that promise. The bible illustrates for us God's faithfulness.

One of the most famous biblical stories of promise regards Abram (Abraham) and Sarai (Sarah). In Genesis 12, Abram first receives this great promise from God:

Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed.

And Abram, in obedience, goes to the land of Canaan. The Lord tells him, "To your offspring I will give this land." So Abram is given a promise of land, but told that he himself will never receive it. It is a promise for his offspring, but he will never gain possession of it himself. Abram As chief priest of the family, Abram builds an altar in worship to God.

But then we read that there is a famine in the land, so Abram and Sarai travel to Egypt. Abram is frightened the Egyptians will kill him to take his beautiful wife, and so he passes Sarai off as his sister. As a result, Pharaoh decides to take Sarai as his wife (unknowingly breaking the 6<sup>th</sup> commandment), and the mother of the promised nation is placed in jeopardy. In response to Abram's deceit, the Lord afflicts Pharaoh's house with plagues and Pharaoh realizes that his misfortune is due to Sarai. Pharaoh confronts Abram regarding his lie, and then sends him on his way with his wife, Lot, and their possessions.

Abram heads north and he and Lot separate as they have been blessed with livestock too numerous for the land to support them both. And again the Lord appears to Abram in Genesis 13:14-17, and promises land and offspring. Abram again builds an altar and they worship the Lord.

When the Lord appears to Abram in a vision and Abram confronts him regarding the promise of offspring, as none have yet been born to Sarai. The Lord assures Abram that his descendants will be numerous like the stars, and Abram "believed the Lord and the Lord reckoned it to him as righteousness."

Sarai grows antsy as she is unable to conceive and so she takes matters into her own hands by giving her slave-girl, Hagar, to Abram saying, "You see that the Lord has prevented me from bearing children; go in to my slave-girl; it may be that I shall obtain children by her." Abram does as Sarai directs him to do, and then real trouble begins when Hagar conceives and bears Ishmael. The triangle between the two women and Abram eventually ends in Hagar and Ishmael both being turned out from the family into the wilderness. This is the start of the fighting between the Jews and the Arabs.

When Abram is 99 years old, the Lord appears and renews his promise to Abram regarding numerous descendants and the land. The Lord gives circumcision to Abram as a sign of the promise. The Lord changes Abram's name to Abraham and Sarai's name to Sarah, and promises that Sarah, who is ninety, will bear a son. Abraham falls on his face in laughter at the prospect that he and his elderly wife having a son at this advanced age. But the Lord assures him that Isaac will be borne by Sarah, and God's covenant will be made with Isaac, not Ishmael.

Again the Lord appears to Abraham just as three men by the oaks of Mamre in Genesis 18. One of the men tells Abraham that Sarah shall have a son in due season. This time it is the aged Sarah who laughs in disbelief.

After interceding with the Lord for the sake of Sodom and Gomorrah, Abraham again passes off his wife Sarah, the mother of the promised son Isaac, as his sister to save his own life in Gerar. King Abimelech takes beautiful Sarah, who is ninety, but the Lord appears to him in a dream warning of the coming curse, "You are about to die because of the woman whom you have taken; for she is a married woman." The next morning Abimelech questions Abraham, "What were you thinking of, that you did this thing?" before sending them both on their way with gifts of sheep, oxen, slaves, and silver – gifts of blessing despite Abraham's deceit.

The long awaited Isaac, promised child, is finally born when Abraham and Sara are 100 and 91 years old, respectively. God was faithful to his promise, though Abraham and Sarah were unfaithful. Yet despite human unfaithfulness it is through Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob that the true promised offspring of the Lord was to be born, the one through whom all the families of the earth, will be blessed: the Savior, Jesus Christ.

And so we too are a people who have received from God in baptism a promise which we do not see with our eyes. That promise which comes to us through Abraham that all nations shall be blessed will be affirmed to our five confirmands on Sunday, April 29. Abraham's promised offspring, Jesus, came into the world and died for us, that we may be blessed with the forgiveness of sin, everlasting life, and salvation. Christ Jesus, in his death, has overcome the world already for us. Believe this promise that it may be reckoned to you as righteousness, the righteousness of Christ which is given to you as the gift of faith.

Each confirmation class, bible study, and worship service is designed to renew us in this promise – over and over again! Come, receive the promise and be renewed in your faith!


