Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Greetings! Again this year I attended the *Here We Still Stand* conference in San Diego, California. This year the theme was The Common Faith, which focused specifically on the historic creeds: Apostle's, Nicene, and Athanasius.

What is a Creed? I received a free copy *Credo: I Believe* edited by Caleb Keith and Kelsi Klembara (1517 Publishing, 2019) from the conference and I'd like to share with you an excerpt:

The development of the historical Christian creeds arose out of the struggle to clearly and concisely define the truths of Scripture and reject beliefs contrary to the gospel of Jesus Christ. Thus, the creeds became a guiding light, highlighting the essential truths revealed by the Scriptures. When people speak these truths, they are making a confession. They are personally binding and trusting themselves to its words.

Sometimes confessing is seen as a totally negative experience. The imagination is drawn to a courtroom or a Roman Catholic confessional box, where the guilty party is prepared to alleviate his or her conscience and in return, receive his or her sentence. However, in the Christian life, confessing is not inherently negative. In either positive or negative form, both a confession of the faith and a confession of sin are great gifts from God.

The Christian life is one of confession—confession of true guilt and confession of true hope, as well as confession of true law and confession of true gospel. The earliest public Christian confessions of faith are referred to as creeds. Simply put, creeds are the formulation of biblical truths into public statements.

It is not unusual for contemporary Christians and Christian churches to reject or replace the use of the creeds. Justin Holcomb highlights this problem: Nowadays, we have a largely literate population and an ample supply of Bibles, and so it's easy to wonder whether creeds are necessary. Some may even think that the creeds stand in opposition to (or at least in tension with) the authority of Holy Scripture.

However, this opposition to the creeds misunderstands that they are not a force used to contain or limit Scripture. Instead, Holcomb continues, "creeds are themselves drawn from the Bible and provide a touchstone to the faith for Christians of all times and places." The core of that touchstone is belief in the death and resurrection of Christ for the forgiveness of sins, a truth that the creeds have helped maintain throughout history even when teachers and preachers have forgotten it.

Christians did not invent the confessions contained in the early creeds. Rather, they were taken directly from Scripture. Scripture itself contains portions of creeds and encourages their use. Romans 10:9–10 states, "[I]f you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved." And 1 Timothy 3:16 says, "Great indeed, we confess, is the mystery of godliness: He was manifested in the flesh, vindicated by the Spirit, seen by angels, proclaimed among the nations, believed on in this world, taken up in glory."

These scriptural confessions are short and memorable, recounting the reality, purpose, and accomplishment of Christ's life and salvific work. It is all but impossible to memorize the entirety of the Bible verse by verse. It's hard to memorize just one book. Creeds allow us to condense the teachings of the Bible into a short statement so the core doctrines of Christianity can be memorized by heart. With the creeds, believers may never be without both these treasured truths, in good times as well as times of trouble and doubt.

Join us each Sunday as together we confess what we believe using our historic creeds. See you in church!

Stewardship & Giving Strategy

As Christian stewards, we share the responsibility of making St. Paul Lutheran Church a vibrant source of service to the spiritual, physical, and emotional needs of the world. That includes providing financial support for today's needs and building a firm financial foundation for tomorrow.

Recent changes in tax law have increased the popularity of a unique giving strategy referred to as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) or IRA Charitable Transfer. Several of our members are already taking advantage of this.

What you need to know:

- ***What You Can Give:*** Individual Retirement Account (IRA) balances.
- ***Age Requirement:*** You must be 70 1/2 years old or older when the distribution is made.
- ***Directly to the Charity:*** Distributions must be made directly from your IRA to the charity.
- ***Professional Advice.*** Please consult with your tax or legal professional.

Who can benefit:

- ***Individuals who take required minimum withdrawals and want to avoid paying tax on the distribution.*** Give your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) directly to a qualified charity without having to report it as taxable income. Contact your IRA administrator to learn the amount of your RMD.
- ***Taxpayers who don't itemize their deductions****. An IRA charitable transfer most benefits the nearly 90% of Americans who do not itemize deductions on their tax returns and therefore do not receive a federal tax benefit for giving to charity.

QCD Example:

In 2019, Adam has an IRA Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) of \$5,000. He decides he wants to have \$1,000 transferred by way of QCD to St. Paul Lutheran Church. Adam will need to ask his IRA custodian to send \$1,000 directly to the church and \$4,000 to him. If the QCD is done correctly, Adam will only need to claim \$4,000 as taxable income. If Adam had paid a combined 20% in federal and state income tax before giving the \$1,000 to St. Paul's he would have only had \$800 to give after taxes.

*The amount transferred by QCD is not included in the donor's Adjusted Gross Income (AGI). The IRA custodian will send tax documents to the donor showing that the money was withdrawn from the IRA account. That tax document is not coded any different than a normal distribution. However, the donor will also get a letter from the charity indicating that they received the gift of the IRA by way of QCD. The donor should take caution to match these two documents up and deliver to accountant so that the person preparing the tax return knows of the QCD! Please do not assume your accountant will know that the QCD occurred! It is critical in today's tax environment to not claim this QCD transfer as taxable income as it can lead to unnecessary inclusion in the AGI and lead to higher income tax, social security tax, and Medicare premium.
