On October 6, we will have a crucial Congregational meeting. The reason for the meeting is to consider whether we want to enter into mutual ministry with St John's Lutheran.

The mutual ministry proposal is not becoming one congregation with Saint John's. Instead, we would continue as two separate congregations and share pastoral and programmatic staff.

There are several reasons for considering a mutual ministry with Saint John's. First and foremost, there is a drastic shortage of pastors available for call. Speaking personally, I usually receive two or three inquiries a month from congregations, wondering if I am available for either a permanent call or as an intentional interim. I inform them every time that I am not available. I am committed to be your interim until you find your next permanent Pastor.

The demand, however, for pastoral leadership is high. The Call committee has been working hard over the summer and has had very little response. They will give a full update at the meeting.

There are numerous positive aspects to consider when it comes to a mutual ministry. If the two congregations were to share a lead pastor, it would open up resources for hiring another programmatic staff member, specifically focusing on youth and families. This additional staff member need not be an ordained pastor and could even be someone from our own community.

In addition, a formal partnership would build on the mutual ministry that we have already started with St. John's. This summer, the Feed My Starving Children Mission Trip, The Community Night Out Picnic, and Rally Sunday were high points of our congregational life.

The cooperation of the two congregations will also allow us to reach critical mass for specific ministries. For example, I am teaching confirmation for St John's and St Paul's. We have nearly twenty kids in the class, which is an excellent size for a youth group, and that doesn't even include our senior high students in both congregations.

This is your decision as a congregation. It is not mine. It is an important decision. For the reasons outlined above, I would encourage you to consider carefully a mutual ministry partnership with St. John's Lutheran Church.

M/S/P to approve the Secretary's Report of the August 14, 2024 meeting.

M/S/P to approve the Financial Statement as printed.

Pastor's Report

- Conducted one pre-Baptism meeting
- Conducted two counseling sessions.
- Met with Pastor Kelly (St. Johns pulpit supply pastor).
- •Led four of the five combined worship services for St. Johns and St. Paul's churches.
- •Will be doing pulpit fill on Sundays at St. Johns Church beginning September 15. St. Paul's worship will be at 9:00 a.m. and St. Johns will be at 10:30 a.m.
- •Will be leading Confirmation classes for St. Johns and St. Paul's students beginning September 18. The classes will meet at St. Johns Church. There are 18 students in the class this year.

Parish Education

- •Sunday School staff is in place for the coming year.
- •Sunday School will begin on September 15.
- •Student presentations will be as follows: Cradle Roll Doves and Kindergarten Bibles on September 22; First Grade Catechisms on September 29; and Third Grade Bibles on October 6.
- •Some changes have been made to the required memorization for each class this year.

Old Business

- Parsonage window and paint repair from hail damage will require photos and quotes submitted to our insurance company. The damage was due to hail last October. Building and Grounds is waiting for quotes to do repairs. Will cost around \$300 to repair the window but will also get a quote to replace it.
- •The Call Committee has been meeting. They have reached out to possible candidates with not a lot of response.
- •The needed updates to the Fire Protection Equipment in the church kitchen equipment is being looked into.
- •No one has stepped forward to direct the Bell Choir. At this time no action will take place.
- •Church Auction will take place Sunday, October 13 right after the worship service.
- •German Supper will be Wednesday, September 18. Council members were encouraged to sell tickets and to help with the event.

New Business

- •Discussion on holding a Special Congregational Meeting to inform everyone on the Call Committee's work and also everyone's feelings about the possibility of sharing a pastor with St. Johns Church. M/S/P to have Chairman Muske work on setting up the meeting. Everyone agreed that Pastor Carl should be at the meeting and that it should happen on a Sunday morning following the worship service.
- •St. Johns Church has agreed to pay \$400 per week to St. Paul's for the extra duties Pastor Carl is performing for their congregation. M/S/P to accept the offer.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer. M/S/P to adjourn at 8:30 p.m.
